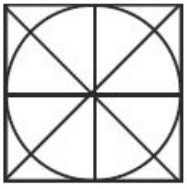

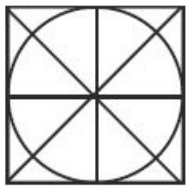

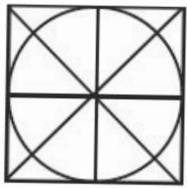




Unique Guest Quarters

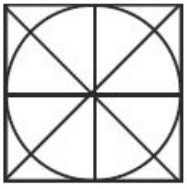


Intimate & Cozy

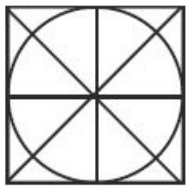

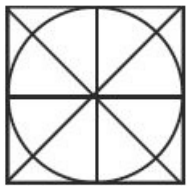
